

### Structure

How the text is set up: Paragraphs, stanzas, headers, bullets, etc. How words, sentences, and lines are structured: rhyming, same number of syllables, same parts of speech repeated in the same order (parallel structure) Writing Strategies: Tools that add to meaning

## Literary Elements/ Devices

Devices ex: metaphor, simile, characterization, conflict, repetition, alliteration.

## **Mood and Tone**

Mood: how does the text make you feel? What emotions?

Tone: what emotions is the author feeling?

## Twinkle, Twinkle, Little Star

Structure: Syllables- all but two lines have seven syllables (usually, the lines that are different are the most important). Structure-four stanzas, 31 lines Rhyming- AABB

Symbolism- star= the listener

Imagery- light and darkness
